Medications in Nephrotic Syndrome: Rituximab

When do we use rituximab?

In children who may not get better with steroids and other immunosuppressive treatments, have repeated relapses, or have side effects to steroids

Using rituximab with another medication (usually mycophenolate) is most effective at prolonging remission

The effects of rituximab usually last 3-6 months


How is rituximab given?



Rituximab is a medication injected into your (your child's) vein in the hospital. Typically, you (your child) will receive two doses, two weeks apart. The medication is given slowly over several hours.

Subsequent doses will be decided by the healthcare team.

Precautions on rituximab





YOU WILL GET OTHER MEDICINES TO PREVENT REACTIONS

Acetaminophen (Tylenol®), cetirizine (Zyrtec®), and steroids will be given before you (your child) receive(s) rituximab to help prevent allergic reactions.

Side effects

You (your child) may experience these symptoms during the time the drug is being given, or shortly after:



Nausea, vomiting, loose stools, or change in stool color



Flushing He diz t



Headache, dizziness, or trouble breathing



Swelling of tongue or throat




Blurred vision

You (your child) may experience these side effects within 6 months of ritux infusion:

Low levels of antibodies (IgG)* in blood (~51%)-maybe associated with infections

Mild viral respiratory, oral infections and chickenpox (~5%) Low levels of white blood cells (neutrophils)* in blood (~4%)

Seek immediate medical care if you have (your child has) any of these side effects:



Most side effects are mild, including after repeated doses.

The following side effects are very rare.

They include neurological, gastrointestinal, cardiovascular,

respiratory disease, severe infections and cancers.





^{*}These blood levels are regularly monitored by your (your child's) care team
